

Purpose of today's program: HB 451, Nonopioid Alternatives – Awaiting Governor's approval – pending by 6/28, Effective date, July 1st Review the anticipated new requirements – WHAT! Facilitate discussion on how hospital's plan to comply – HOW?

Anticipated New Requirements

- 1. Legislative Findings Section
 - Every competent adult has the right to refuse an opioid drug.
- Educational Pamphlet to be developed by the Department of Health
- 3. Health Practitioner Requirements Anesthesia and Treatment of Pain
 - Inform, discuss alternatives, provide pamphlet, document



Health Practitioner Requirements

- Prior to anesthesia or the treatment of pain, except in the provision of emergency services:
 - Inform the patient of available nonopioid medicinal drugs, interventional procedures or treatments, acupuncture, chiropractic treatments, massage therapy, physical therapy, occupational therapy, or any other appropriate therapy "as determined by the health care practitioner."
 - Discuss advantages and disadvantages of the use of the alternatives, including whether the patient is at risk of, or has a history of controlled substance abuse or misuse and the patient's personal preferences.
 - Provide the patient with the DOH educational pamphlet.
 - Document the nonopioid alternatives considered in the patient's record.

Mission to Care. Vision to Lead.

Health Care Practitioner

- "health care practitioner, excluding those licensed under chapter 465"
 - Pharmacists are excluded from the requirements in HB 451



Exception – Emergency Services Care

- As defined in 395.002, FS
- (9) "Emergency services and care" means medical screening, examination, and evaluation by a physician, or, to the extent permitted by applicable law, by other appropriate personnel under the supervision of a physician, to determine if an emergency medical condition exists and, if it does, the care, treatment, or surgery by a physician necessary to relieve or eliminate the emergency medical condition, within the service capability of the facility.



HOW – Plans to comply?

In the hospital setting, a patient may have the need for anesthesia services as well as ordering and administering of opioid drugs for the treatment of pain. Use of these medications may be periodic throughout the hospital stay. What plans do you have to comply with the new law?



Questions for Consideration

- At what point do you plan to inform the patient about opioid alternatives and discuss their preferences?
- When do you plan to give the patient the DOH educational pamphlet?
- When and how do you plan to document in the patient's medical record the nonopioid alternatives considered?
 - On admission?
 - Prior to surgery re anesthesia?
 - When an opioid medication for pain is ordered?
 - When an opioid medication for pain is administration

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HB 451 – Nonopioid Alternatives – Pending approval by the Governor FHA will notify you when action is taken on the bill – AND – when the DOH pamphlet is posted on their website. Upon approval, effective July 1st, health practitioners will be required, prior to administering opioid drugs for anesthesia or the treatment of pain, to inform/discuss nonopioid alternatives, provide the DOH pamphlet and document alternatives considered.
